Overview and Status Update of the \$1603 Program

April 1, 2017

This document provides a brief overview and status update of the \$1603 American Recovery and Reinvestment Tax Act (ARRTA) program. The program began accepting applications on July 31, 2009.

The §1603 program offers renewable energy project developers cash payments in lieu of investment tax credits (ITC).¹ The value of an award is equivalent to 30% of the project's total eligible cost basis in most cases. Qualifying technologies include:

- biomass
- combined heat and power
- fuel cells
- geothermal
- incremental hydropower •
- landfill gas

- marine hydrokinetic microturbine
- municipal solid waste
- solar
- wind

As of March 31, 2017

- total number of projects funded = 105,972
- total §1603 funding = \$25.7 Billion •
- total estimated private, regional, state, and federal • investment in §1603 projects = **\$93.8 Billion**
- total installed capacity of funded projects = 34.5 GW
- total estimated annual electricity generation from funded projects = 91.2 TWh

Impact

- 91.2 TWh is the equivalent of the following:
 - Roughly 8,440,000 homes.² 0
 - The state of Colorado used 54.39 TWh in 2016³ 0

¹ An additional provision of ARRA allows project developers who are eligible for the production tax credit (PTC) to instead elect to receive the ITC or an equivalent cash grant.






Figure 1: Number of Projects by Type⁴





⁴ Residential Solar comprises projects under 10kW. Residential Solar projects must be owned by an eligible applicant and used in a trade or business or for the production of income.





Figure 4: Estimated Generation by Project Type
